WESTGATE HALLS

CHICHESTER CAMPUS

Westgate is an on-campus, self-catering hall of residence. It provides superb accommodation for 160 students, aged 18 and over. It has single en-suite rooms arranged in 'flats' of six, with a kitchen/diner and Wi-Fi. Some have been specifically designed to meet the needs of students with disabilities.

Students have use of the on-site gym and sports facilities. Westgate is open and staffed 24 hours with overnight security.

WOODLANDS HALLS

CHICHESTER CAMPUS

Woodlands provides secure accommodation for 90 students, aged between 16-18 at the time of admission. It has single and twin bedded study bedrooms, many of which are en-suite. All rooms are well appointed with study facilities, including Wi-Fi, and storage space.

It is staffed 24 hours a day by trained supervisors who provide excellent welfare support for the residents. A full enrichment package is also included, while students have access to the on-site gym and sports facilities. All students living in Woodlands are on a full-board basis, with meals included in the cost.

The leadership and management of the residential provision are outstanding. Residential learners are highly valued and benefit to a significant degree from the quality of support they receive.

HOMESTAY

HALF-BOARD HOMESTAY CHICHESTER AND BRINSBURY

Students live-in with a family in their home. Meals are provided and students usually eat with the family. Perfect for international students who wish to practice their English language skills.

SELF-CATERING HOMESTAY CHICHESTER AND BRINSBURY

This is similar to half-board homestay in many respects, but students provide their own food and do their own cooking and washing up. Laundry is also the student's responsibility.

Both half-board and self-catering homestay options are available for our home students as well as international students.

HOW TO APPLY

You can apply directly to the college at anytime or you can apply to UCAS. If you are applying to multiple institutions you should definitely apply via UCAS. However, if you are unsure about your choices, or are a mature applicant and would like further guidance, we are always here to provide impartial help to you during the application process.

You should apply to UCAS between 5 September 2018 and 15 January 2019. Applications through UCAS cost £13 for a single choice or £24 for multiple choices.

Our highly qualified and experienced staff are committed to ensuring that every student is offered the best possible learning experience across this extensive range of subjects, many of which are not available in local schools.

Our A-level programme is open to students of all ages, whether you are about to complete your GCSEs or a mature student wishing to return to study.

We support you with extensive resources including well equipped laboratories, a custom designed theatre, art studios, comprehensive up-to-date computer facilities and A-level specific study zones and computer facilities.

Most students study three A-levels. At interview our staff will guide you as to the ideal number for you based on your abilities, interests and future plans.

You'll experience high quality teaching and a level of support described as 'outstanding' in our latest Ofsted inspection. Chichester College is known for its friendliness and its concern for the overall quality of students' experience whilst at college. We are committed to providing opportunities for all students to develop their skills and interests, both in class and outside of the subject study. This helps prepare you for higher education, work or an apprenticeship after A-level study.

You can opt for exciting qualifications to complement your other studies and support entry to study higher education. The Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) and the CREST Award give you the opportunity to research a subject or topic of your choice. You'll be supported through input on research methods and tutorials as your project develops. The EPQ develops independent research and study skills which many universities regard highly. The CREST Award develops your practical project and teamwork skills. We also offer a range of mini qualifications to give you the competitive edge in reaching your future goals.

By coming to Chichester College to study your A-levels, you can take advantage of all the opportunities available across the college:

- Study in our 'Open Access' computer suite or in our well-stocked library
- Enjoy our wide range of sports, cultural and artistic social events that will give you a great choice of activities outside of your academic studies
- Join our Student Union which has earned a national reputation for its dynamism and its commitment to representing students' views in the college
- Volunteer to help support our school in Kenya and other exciting projects

HOW TO APPLY

Check your subject combinations on the timetable matrix to ensure the subjects do not clash. This is available from our Admissions team or at our open events. If you have any questions or queries about the options available, please contact Admissions on **01243 786321**.

Once we have received your application, you'll receive an invitation to an A-level interview or applicant evening. Once you are offered a place, you'll be invited along to a Taster Day. You will also need to complete an A-level Transition Project for each of your subjects to prepare you for A-level study.

GOVERNMENT CHANGES

Since September 2016, A-levels have changed and every subject is now assessed at the end of the second year. Fewer subjects have coursework elements and for those that do, the coursework is worth a smaller percentage – not more than 20% of the overall mark.

At Chichester College, we enter all students for the externally assessed AS exams at the end of year 1 to give you a robust exam experience to enhance your development. The marks no longer contribute to the overall A-Level grade but the experience prepares you for success in the second year.

ABOUT THE COURSE

A-level accounting helps you to understand the responsibilities of an accountant and the impact of their recommendations on a business. You will be able to apply these skills in fields ranging from banking and law, to the media and agriculture. Musicians work in a huge variety of locations. These include: rehearsal rooms, recording studios, performance venues, festivals, holiday camps and schools and colleges. When composing or teaching, they may also often work from home.

What the job involves?

Using your musical talent to have a positive impact on the people that listen to it.

What skills would you need?

Creativity; musical knowledge; determination; communication; confidence; patience and self-motivation.

All students perform at the college's very own festival, Chi-Fest, in June.

WHERE NEXT

Completing the course will serve as an ideal preparation for you to progress to the level 3 Diploma in Music Practice (Pop) or Music Technology.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Students should have a good level of education at GCSE, and an enthusiasm for music. Students must have some basic skills on an instrument or voice.

We really want to give you a sense of what it is like to work in the music industry and provide you with the necessary skills to ensure that you have the best start to your career. You will be taught how to capture, edit, mix and master band recordings using some of the best industry standard equipment available. You will be shown how to write, sequence, arrange and remix your own music, plus take a trip to the famous Real World Recording Studios. With this course you will develop the tools for success in an exciting and creative industry.

WHERE NEXT

This course will enable students to progress on to year two and achieve the equivalent of 3 A-levels. After completion of the two year course you can look to apply to our HE (level 4 and 5) courses here at Chichester College.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

For all students: 4 GCSE Grades (A*/9- C/4) minimum. English and maths is also priority (4-9 on the new system). Mature students will be assessed by their experience. Playing an instrument is not essential.

POPULAR MUSIC

ABOUT THE COURSE

In the first year you will complete the 60 Credit Diploma in Music. You must successfully complete year 1 in order to progress to year 2. In year 2 you will continue to develop instrumental skills and group performance skills through a series of performance based projects. You compile a portfolio of original songs and recordings and learn how to use music notation software. You will create your own website to showcase your employment skills. You will also learn about the history and development of popular music and its current and historical role in society.

WHERE NEXT

Last year over 80% of our students progressed to University Degree Courses. Many of our former students have entered the Music Industry directly working as performers, studio engineers, teachers, composers or running their own music agencies.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You will need 5 GCSEs (A-C) including Maths and English. At audition you will need show competent level of musical skills on an instrument or voice. Ideally you will have had some experience of performing live and working with a group or band though this is not compulsory.



CREATIVE SOUND DESIGN FOR FILM & GAMING

ABOUT THE COURSE

The HND in Creative Sound Design for Film & Gaming develops a number of important skills, knowledge and understanding required to succeed in employment in the creative industries. The course gives students the opportunity to take advantage of specialist audio software to design and create sounds, as well as compose music to a variety of different situations. Students will also have access to our new hybrid recording studios where they will learn and develop their understanding of good audio capture. Year 1 comprises the HNC (Level 4 Higher National Certificate) qualification. Students can then progress on to the second year HND (Level 5 Higher National Diploma) to fully complete the qualification.

WHERE NEXT

The BTEC Level 5 HND Diploma will enable learners to progress on to further study such as a degree or straight into employment in the creative sector. Creative sound design offers an incredibly diverse range of career paths.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You will need to have a combination of GCE A-levels, level 3 diploma or extended diploma in relevant subjects such as music production. All applicants will be asked to present a portfolio of work and will be asked to attend an interview.

ABOUT THE COURSE

The next step for Level 3 students looking for a sustainable career pathway and broader engagement with the 'standup' skills of performance in commercial music, song-writing and production. Whether you are working towards a career in musical theatre, music for film and television, live performance, recording studio skills, jazz and improvisation or producing for other artists, you will benefit from the foundation program. The materials cover most contemporary commercial genres from jazz, the Great American Songbook, soul, funk, R'n'B and hip-hop, to film and television sound arrangements. Working with our team of industry professionals you will improve your skills and heighten your understanding of music to set you on a path to becoming the complete musician within a vibrant industry sector.

WHERE NEXT

This course provides opportunities for graduates to enter employment within a range of musical and production industries, or progress on to a degree course at university.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You will need to have a combination of GCE A-levels, BTEC level 3 diploma or extended diploma in relevant subject. All applicants must attend an audition and interview to demonstrate appropriate experience and a commitment to pursue music.

Our courses provide progression routes into training, employment, further and higher education.

During your course of study there will be many opportunities to expand your performance skills in productions both inside and outside of College.

Many of our students have achieved successful careers on stage and TV gaining roles in productions as diverse as Evita, Les Miserables, Hollyoaks and Warhorse. They have performed at Edinburgh Fringe and joined major dance and acting companies including the National Theatre and forged successful careers in stage management.

We also have a busy Dance School which offers a range of dance classes, for 3-16 year olds, from ballet, modern and tap to musical theatre. Here students studying ISTD, DDI and DDE will have the opportunity to enhance their teaching skills.

YOUR FUTURE

The industry is competitive but for those with talent there are opportunities in all aspect of theatrical performance; dance, acting, musical theatre and stage management as well as TV work, teaching, community work, higher education and much more.

Where would you work?

This will vary depending on your role. Examples include working in theatres, either on stage or backstage, or working in private or public schools/colleges and community projects that deliver performing arts courses/projects.

What the job involves?

Performing Arts is primarily about using interpersonal skills to work together as a team, producing and performing smooth running, enjoyable productions for an audience.

What skills would you need?

Confidence, organisation, creativity, interpersonal skills, attention to detail, teamwork, determination and discipline.

ACTOR/ACTRESS > SALARY £ VARIABLE

Actors/Actresses are part of a team (cast) guided by a director. They bring to life a character written by playwrights and scriptwriters. Significant aspects of the life of an actor include; contacting agents and auditioning for parts, researching roles, learning lines and teamwork.

CHOREOGRAPHER > SALARY £23,000 - £60,000

Choreographers work collaboratively with other members of a production team to create both short dance sequences and full length works. They choreograph for stage, TV and film and music videos.

STAGE MANAGER > SALARY £20,000 - £55,000

Stage Managers are responsible for organising all practical and technical aspects of rehearsals and shows, ensuring all crew and performers are in the right place at the right time so the performances run smoothly.

ABOUT THE COURSE

This qualification will develop your current levels of skills and introduce you to new areas of dance. The course aims to develop the artistic, creative, technical and professional skills that a dancer needs in order to prepare for further vocational training. The course offers a breadth of styles and approaches including contemporary, jazz, ballet, choreography and physical theatre. There is a positive and supportive learning environment and a strong practical focus.

WHERE NEXT

On successful completion of the Dance Level 2 qualification, you can progress to a Dance Level 3 Diploma at the College (through audition) or employment. Popular routes include progression on the Level 3 Diploma in Dance or Musical Theatre.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You will have a GCSE profile of C and D grades (3-4 on the new system). Some dance experience is essential before starting the course. You will be required to attend an audition and prepare a solo for performance to ensure the course will meet your needs.

DANCE Diploma

3

Level 3

ABOUT THE COURSE

This course will develop the artistic, creative, technical and professional skills that a dancer needs in order to fully prepare for a varied and high-level career in the dance industry. You will study a range of dance disciplines including contemporary, ballet, and jazz as well as choreographic, creative, professional and historical studies. A successful first year will enable you to progress to the second year during which you will complete your Extended Diploma (180 credit qualification).

WHERE NEXT

Most students seek further vocational training at professional dance schools or university. Students can progress onto a range courses at Chichester College or, alternatively, study at other colleges including Bird College, Laban Centre and London Studio Centre.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Minimum of 5 GCSEs including English language at grade 4-9 on the new system, alternatively you may have a Merit grade from a Level 2 Dance Diploma plus English language GCSE at grade 4-9 on the new system. Dance experience is essential. All students are auditioned to ensure the course will meet their needs.

DANCE ISTD DDE

4

Level 4

Chichester

ABOUT THE COURSE

This is a challenging Level 4 course. It is aimed at candidates 18 years of age and over who have either achieved the Level 3 DDI qualification and wish to complete their training in order to become a fully qualified and accredited ISTD dance teacher, or wish to commence their training to become a fully qualified and accredited ISTD dance teacher. The DDE has been accredited by Ofqual at Level 4 on the QCF which is roughly equivalent to the level attained at first year degree level. Chichester College offer the DDE in imperial ballet, modern theatre and tap dance.

WHERE NEXT

DDE will enable learners to work in a variety of independent dance schools across the country and abroad or to establish their own dance school. It is also a valuable qualification for progression to the ISTD Licentiate exam and/or the ISTD Level 6 Diploma in Dance Pedagogy.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Learners must be at least 18 years of age and hold their Intermediate qualification in the genre they wish to study. They must also have 5 GCSEs at C grade or above including English and mathematics (4-9 on the new system).



DANCE TEACHING IN THE PRIVATE SECTOR

Foundation Degree

ABOUT THE COURSE

This innovative new two-year Foundation Degree programme is offered in partnership with the University of Chichester. It is designed to prepare students for employment as a dancer, choreographer or community dance practitioner and/or a dance teacher within the independent sector. Students will have the opportunity to broaden their dance knowledge, develop their practical skills in technique, performance and choreography and be awarded the newly designed ISTD Diploma in Dance Education.

WHERE NEXT

Successful completion of this course will enable students to apply for full membership of the ISTD and embark on a career as a fully qualified dance teacher in the independent sector. Alternatively, students may choose to continue their higher education studies by progressing onto the 3rd year BA.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

ISTD Intermediate in the relevant genre (or recognised equivalency). Applicants need to have a combination of GCE A-levels, or BTEC Level 3 Diploma/ Extended Diplomas (or equivalent) totaling 104-120 UCAS tariff points. GCSE maths and English language are preferred at grade C/4. Applicants with industry or previous experience are also considered.

DRAMA



ACTING Diploma

ABOUT THE COURSE

This course offers an exciting opportunity for students of all ages, backgrounds and educational achievements to gain an introduction to Acting and the world of theatre. The course will give you acting experience as well as a range of other work designed to help you understand how theatre works and develop essential background knowledge. Teamwork is an essential part of acting and there is an emphasis on developing your ability to work as part of a team throughout the course.

WHERE NEXT

The course is excellent preparation to the Acting Level 3 Diploma course. There may be the possibility of moving into limited roles within the profession such as backstage work and access to community arts work.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Normally you will have a GCSE profile of C and D grades (3-4 on the new system). However, previous experience or simply a desire to experience theatre acting is essential whatever qualifications you might possess. Admission by workshop and interview.

ACTING Diploma

ABOUT THE COURSE

The course is a vocational programme that will develop your current levels of skill and introduce you to new areas of drama. The overall emphasis of the course is on learning by doing, developing a practical understanding of the performing arts in a broad sense. The Diploma enables students to follow a workshop and production based course that aims to give you a basic grounding in the process of performance and production. It is a 90 credit qual in the first year leading to the Extended Diploma.

WHERE NEXT

The course can lead to entry via successful audition into Higher Education or drama school or Intensive Acting L4 Higher National Certificate at Chichester College.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You must have a minimum of 5 GCSEs including English at grade C or above (4-9 on the new system).

INTENSIVE ACTING 3 90-credit Diploma

ABOUT THE COURSE

This is a challenging course designed for the student desiring to follow a career path in acting. Performance projects are the underlying foundation of the course. As members of our 'IntAct' Theatre Company students will work within a schedule that emulates that of a professional company, taking daily technique classes and rehearsals. Students will also undertake rigorous practical research and academic exploration, which will produce work within the scholarly conventions appropriate to HE.

WHERE NEXT

Progress from this course can lead to drama school, university or directly into the profession.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You should either hold a Level 3 Extended Diploma in a relevant subject (minimum of MMP) or two C grades at GCE A-level. Successful candidates will demonstrate appropriate experience and a commitment to pursue acting as a specialist area of study.

MUSICAL THEATRE

MUSICAL THEATRE 3 Diploma

Level 3

ABOUT THE COURSE

Musical Theatre Diploma is a course which aims to give students an insight into the world of musical theatre training and performance. This is a challenging course designed for the student wishing to follow a career path in theatre or entertainment. This course is the first year of a 2 year course which will complete your Extended Diploma - the equivalent of three A-levels.

WHERE NEXT

Progress from this course can lead to drama or stage school, university or directly into the profession. You will be encouraged to make contact with agents if appropriate and to explore other careers in the performing arts.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

5 GCSEs at grades A-C (4-9 on the new system) one of which must be English. Relevant experience in singing, acting and dance. You will need to complete a successful audition - being strong in at least two disciplines: singing, dance, acting (one must be singing).

PERFORMING ARTS

PERFORMING ARTS 1 Diploma

Level 1

ABOUT THE COURSE

This course forms part of the Level 1 Performing Arts package which spans over 2 years. You will complete Level 1 Diploma in Vocational Studies in the first year and Level 1 Diploma in Performing Arts in the second year. The package covers both skills in all aspects of performing arts, singing, dancing and acting as well as focussing on your own set of goals, how you develop skills for the world of work and developing your own CV. You will experience a range of performance opportunities.

WHERE NEXT

Any level 2 course if appropriate to the learner's academic status. A development in performing arts' skills, confidence and organisation skills that may be used as transferable skills for employment or further study.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

No previous qualifications are required however enthusiasm, commitment and a willingness to participate are essential.

The company will conduct a national tour providing students with the experience of performing with a diverse and challenging repertory.

WHERE NEXT

You can continue with your dance education at university or dance school. Some of you may embark on careers in arts administration and management; choreography; community arts; dance performance and teaching film and television production.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

All applicants are required to complete a successful audition. You will also have a combination of GCE A-levels, level 3 diploma or a BTEC extended diploma at overall Merit (or grade C) or above. GCSE maths and English language are preferred at a 4/C or above.

Our HNC course is a strong foundation year in developing performance techniques, independent discipline and professional practices for entry into further full-time study in accredited drama schools or work in the profession. ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

All applicants are required to complete a successful audition. You will also have a combination of GCE A-levels, level 3 diploma or a BTEC extended diploma at overall Merit (or grade C) or above. GCSE maths and English language are preferred at a 4/C or above.

PERFORMING ARTS (MUSICAL THEATRE)

4

Higher National Certificate

Level 4

ABOUT THE COURSE

This is a challenging course designed for the student desiring to follow a career path in Musical Theatre. Emphasis will be given in the first term to prepare for entry to conservatoire/drama schools. Classes will be delivered in all three performance disciplines – singing, dancing and acting – providing the opportunity for students to become 'triple threat' performers. Within your musical theatre company you will work to a schedule that emulates that of a professional company taking daily technique classes and working towards performance opportunities.

WHERE NEXT

Progress from this course can lead to drama school, university or into theatrical professions. Students will perform as part of a real theatre company, develop their portfolio and networking skills to prepare themselves for the 'world of work'.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

All applicants are required to complete a successful audition. You will also have a combination of GCE A-levels, level 3 diploma or a BTEC extended diploma at overall Merit (or grade C) or above. GCSE maths and English language are preferred at a 4/C or above.

5 GCSEs at grade 4-9 on the new system (must include English language and maths) It is important that you have a genuine interest in this subject and are able to demonstrate a passion for the subject at interview. No previous experience necessary.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Successful completion of a GCSE programme. All applicants will be interviewed for this course upon application. You should have an interest in sport and public services, outdoor activities and recreation.

Welcome to this Level 2 Public Services course. To provide an opportunity for students to gain insight into employment in the uniformed service: develop personal communication and leadership skills through involvement in the Sussex Army Cadet Force and Sussex Fire and Rescue Service. A practical, portfolio based course with the opportunity to attend three extremely relevant and enjoyable residential weeks away in an army camp, outdoor activity environment and ship borne and naval base environment.

WHERE NEXT

BTEC Diploma/Extended Level 3 Diploma in Uniformed Public Services (when combined with a successful completion of GCSE English language and maths). Entry into a uniformed service via application route or employment.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

ADVICE & GUIDANCE

THE STUDENT CENTRE

To make it easy for students to get the help they need, all of our students services are located in one place.

At Chichester, we have a dedicated Student Centre near main reception, which acts as a one stop shop for all student support services. It's open all year round, not just in term time. Drop in any time, phone us or arrange an appointment to discuss anything.

At Brinsbury, the Student Centre is in the courtyard buildings next to Brinsbury House and offers the same services and advice.


STUDENT TUTORS

Student Tutors are here to support you through your time at Chichester College. Every student and apprentice, aged 16-19, has a student tutor and will meet regularly with them. Through personal one-to-one discussions, tutors can monitor progress, set targets, track achievement and support attendance. We place real importance on student tutoring and believe it plays a vital role in helping our students to succeed.

ACHIEVEMENT CHAMPIONS

Our achievement champions offer intensive support to students who are identified as being 'at risk' of not achieving their qualification. Support is tailored to the student, helping to remove barriers they may be facing with the aim of helping them to reach their academic goals. This ranges from signposting the student to support services at the college to engaging external agencies where additional support is required.

Achievement champions also help to manage the college referral and disciplinary system, by supporting the students when



they are 'referred' and working with students to achieve the targets set by the course team and senior management. This helps them get back on track to achieving their potential.

STUDENT FINANCE

The Student Funds Team provide advice on student financial services and guide you to range of other support services. If you are entitled to any benefits, grants, bursaries or other financial support, these are the people to contact. Find out more on pages 136-137.

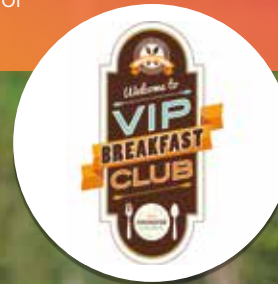

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Leaving school to come to college is a big step, and here at Chichester College we want our students to enjoy their experience and to achieve their full potential.

We believe parental involvement is an important factor in helping your son or daughter succeed. That's why we make a commitment to ensuring we keep you informed of how they are doing at parents' evenings throughout the academic year, through reports and through contact with their student tutor, where appropriate. Parents are also welcome to contact us and make appointments on an individual basis, should you have any concerns or would like to discuss your child's/ward's progress.

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

The process for applying for a course is simple. Applications can be made online, by using the 'apply now' links on the course page on our website: chichester.ac.uk, or completing the application form in this prospectus and either posting it back to us, or dropping it into our reception.

It is important that we have an up to date email address and mobile number as the college may send some information this way.

WHAT NEXT?

Your son/daughter/ward will receive an acknowledgement of their application and will be invited to come in for an interview or a consultation evening. We encourage parents or guardians to attend the interviews. Although the discussions will involve your child/ward there will be an opportunity for you to ask any questions you may have. At the end of the interview, a verbal offer will be made subject to certain conditions, usually exam results.

THE OFFER LETTER

Your son/daughter/ward will receive a written offer, which will confirm any entry conditions given at interview. It will include a reply slip for them to accept their offer. It is important that this is completed and returned as soon as possible.

During the summer, we will contact your son/daughter/ward with detail of their start and where to find additional information relating to their course. This will include any information that has not previously been given out about uniform, equipment and any additional costs (these will have been explained at the interview stage). This letter refers to the course they have been offered a place on but it will not be valid if they fail to meet the entry criteria set out in the offer.

STEM

We offer a wealth of choice across the science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) related courses.

You can study subjects from maths A-levels to diplomas in applied forensic science, not to mention a host of engineering courses across all levels including mechanical engineering. Our experienced staff offer a wealth of knowledge in subjects that can open up a huge variety of job opportunities.

GCSEs

The GCSEs offered with us are designed to give students the confidence and knowledge required to improve a GCSE D/3 grade to that vital C/4 grade - or even above!

This fundamental jump of at least one grade could make a huge difference to their life, helping you to get their dream job or gain a place on your ideal course.

GCSEs are available in English, maths and science and they are open to students of all ages. The courses are taught by experienced staff, who are dedicated to giving the self-belief needed to pass their GCSEs.

GRADING GCSEs

A new grading structure is now in place for all GCSEs. This now sees them graded from 9 to 1 instead of A* to G. The figure shown below indicates how the new grading system aligns with the existing one, with grades 4 and above representing roughly the same level as a grade C or above.

COURSE FEE INFORMATION

IF YOU'RE 16-18

If you're a home student* and are under 18 at the beginning of your course, you won't have to pay tuition or exam fees for most courses. You will have to pay exams fees if you need to resit an exam, however.

You may need to pay for course equipment and materials. You will be told about this at interview.

*Home students are people who have already lived in the UK or EEA for a minimum of three years for reasons other than education.

IF YOU'RE OVER 19

You may be eligible to receive financial help with course fees. If you don't hold a level 2 qualification (eg 5 GCSE at grades A-C) or a level 3 qualification (eg 2 A-levels) and are under 23 years old, you may be able to get a substantial reduction in your fees.

Also, if you select a course leading to a basic skill qualification (English or maths) there will be no tuition fees to pay.

You may also be able to claim for free or discounted courses at entry level and level 1 if you are aiming for a full level 2 course, do not already hold a qualification at this level and are under 23 years old.

ADVANCED LEARNER LOAN

If you're thinking of progressing onto a full-time course and are aged over 19 you may qualify for this loan.

To be eligible you must:

- Be aged 19 or over at the start of your course
- Be a UK resident
- Be applying to study on a course which is level 3** or above

**Defined by the government as a maximum of 3 A-levels; an access to HE course; level 3 and/or level 4 certificates or diplomas; an advanced or higher apprenticeship.

REFUNDS

For courses lasting longer than one term:

If you choose to leave your course within one month of it starting and the course is longer than a term, a refund may be made of fees paid, minus an administration charge and any payments made to examining or other bodies which cannot be reclaimed.

For courses lasting one term or less:

If you booked on a short course and cancel at least 10 working days before the course date, you will receive a refund of 80% of the course fee. If you cancel less than 10 days before the start of the course, or leave the course after it has started, no refund will be given.

If a course is cancelled by us, you'll receive a full refund of fees paid.

FINANCIAL HELP



We're here to help you get the financial support you need. The Student Finance Team, located in the Student Centre, can provide advice on grants that are available.

CHICHESTER COLLEGE LEARNING SUPPORT GRANT & BURSARY

This is our bursaries scheme for 16 to 18 year olds. This grant is funded by the Education Funding Agency and administered by the college.

This grant could provide you with:

- Access to free or subsidised travel
- Free or subsidised equipment, books or resources
- Free or subsidised childcare
- Free UCAS admin fees
- Free college meals
- Contribution towards enrichment activities linked to your course

If you are aged 16 to 18 and are currently in care, just leaving care, receive income support, employment and support allowance or personal independence payments, you may be eligible for the Learning Support Grant.

Financial help is also available for students aged 19 or over.

STEP 2

YOUR INTERVIEW

We'll need to arrange a meeting with you before we can formally accept you onto the course. Don't worry - the interview is there to help give you advice and guidance on any additional help you might need and to make sure the course is right for you. It will usually be with your course tutor and there may be a short aptitude test involved, but nothing too scary!

We aim to arrange your interview within nine weeks of your acknowledgement letter.

STEP 3

ACCEPTING A PLACE

Within 2 weeks of your interview, we'll send you a letter to confirm that you've been offered a place. The offer will either be unconditional (you don't have to do anything) or conditional (you'll be told in your interview what the conditions are eg the GCSE grades you need).

You will need to complete the acceptance slip found in your letter ASAP and return it to us. Don't forget to return this slip - it's very important that we know you're coming!

STEP 4

STARTING COLLEGE

A few weeks before the start of your first course we'll contact you and let you know where to come on your first day and at what time, also where to find further information. It's important the college has an up to date email address or mobile number in order to send this information to you.

You'll need to display a valid pay and display ticket from the machine or you can buy a pre-paid season ticket which must be displayed.

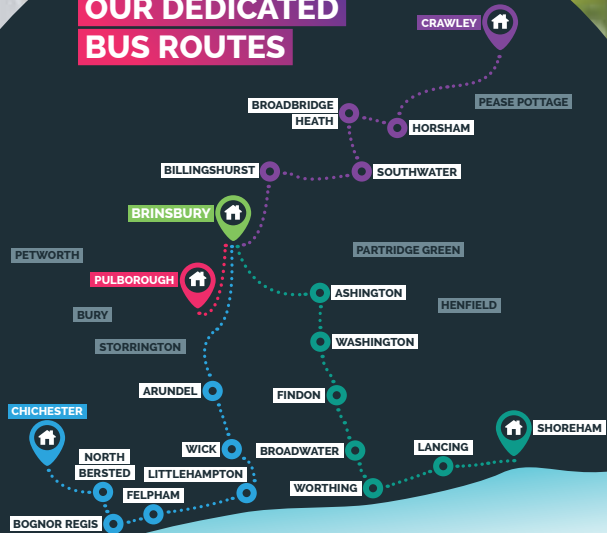

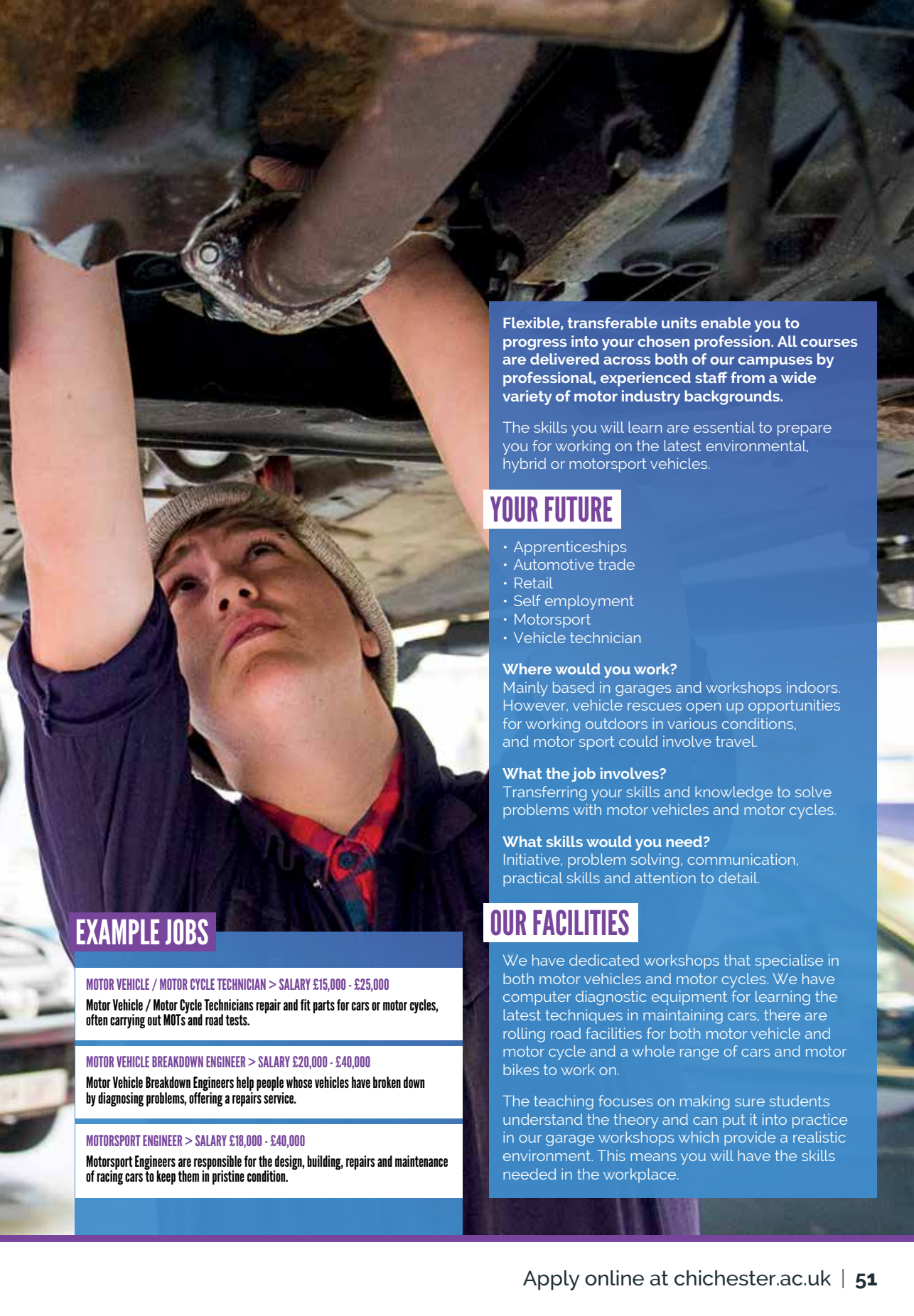

The course has been designed for students to boost their independence and confidence, tailored around the individual student to provide a supported progression to the next stage of their lives. The course focuses on developing social skills, independence in the home and introducing attributes needed for work. It also encourages and supports student progression to higher courses.

WHERE NEXT

Students can stay on the course and complete year 2. After this students can leave college and move to supported employment or progress to the Progression +1 course.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

An interest in becoming more independent and developing skills for work. Suitability for the programme will be assessed both before joining the programme and during the first six weeks of the course.

ABOUT THE COURSE

This course is designed to allow learners the opportunity to experience some of the varied vocational areas the college has to offer as well as improving their English, maths, ICT and employability skills. ADVICE & GUIDANCE

THE STUDENT CENTRE

To make it easy for students to get the help they need, all of our students services are located in one place.

At Chichester, we have a dedicated Student Centre near main reception, which acts as a one stop shop for all student support services. It's open all year round, not just in term time. Drop in any time, phone us or arrange an appointment to discuss anything.

At Brinsbury, the Student Centre is in the courtyard buildings next to Brinsbury House and offers the same services and advice.


STUDENT TUTORS

Student Tutors are here to support you through your time at Chichester College. Every student and apprentice, aged 16-19, has a student tutor and will meet regularly with them. Through personal one-to-one discussions, tutors can monitor progress, set targets, track achievement and support attendance. We place real importance on student tutoring and believe it plays a vital role in helping our students to succeed.

ACHIEVEMENT CHAMPIONS

Our achievement champions offer intensive support to students who are identified as being 'at risk' of not achieving their qualification. Support is tailored to the student, helping to remove barriers they may be facing with the aim of helping them to reach their academic goals. This ranges from signposting the student to support services at the college to engaging external agencies where additional support is required.

Achievement champions also help to manage the college referral and disciplinary system, by supporting the students when



they are 'referred' and working with students to achieve the targets set by the course team and senior management. This helps them get back on track to achieving their potential.

STUDENT FINANCE

The Student Funds Team provide advice on student financial services and guide you to range of other support services. If you are entitled to any benefits, grants, bursaries or other financial support, these are the people to contact. Find out more on pages 136-137.

STUDENT WELFARE

The physical and mental wellbeing of all our students is extremely important to us, so we provide a number of support services.

FIRST AID & HEALTH

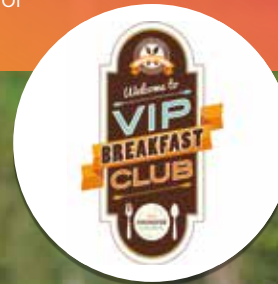

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Leaving school to come to college is a big step, and here at Chichester College we want our students to enjoy their experience and to achieve their full potential.

We believe parental involvement is an important factor in helping your son or daughter succeed. That's why we make a commitment to ensuring we keep you informed of how they are doing at parents' evenings throughout the academic year, through reports and through contact with their student tutor, where appropriate. Parents are also welcome to contact us and make appointments on an individual basis, should you have any concerns or would like to discuss your child's/ward's progress.

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

The process for applying for a course is simple. Applications can be made online, by using the 'apply now' links on the course page on our website: chichester.ac.uk, or completing the application form in this prospectus and either posting it back to us, or dropping it into our reception.

It is important that we have an up to date email address and mobile number as the college may send some information this way.

WHAT NEXT?

Your son/daughter/ward will receive an acknowledgement of their application and will be invited to come in for an interview or a consultation evening. We encourage parents or guardians to attend the interviews. Although the discussions will involve your child/ward there will be an opportunity for you to ask any questions you may have. At the end of the interview, a verbal offer will be made subject to certain conditions, usually exam results.

THE OFFER LETTER

Your son/daughter/ward will receive a written offer, which will confirm any entry conditions given at interview. It will include a reply slip for them to accept their offer. It is important that this is completed and returned as soon as possible.

During the summer, we will contact your son/daughter/ward with detail of their start and where to find additional information relating to their course. This will include any information that has not previously been given out about uniform, equipment and any additional costs (these will have been explained at the interview stage). This letter refers to the course they have been offered a place on but it will not be valid if they fail to meet the entry criteria set out in the offer.

STEM

We offer a wealth of choice across the science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) related courses.

You can study subjects from maths A-levels to diplomas in applied forensic science, not to mention a host of engineering courses across all levels including mechanical engineering. Our experienced staff offer a wealth of knowledge in subjects that can open up a huge variety of job opportunities.

GCSEs

The GCSEs offered with us are designed to give students the confidence and knowledge required to improve a GCSE D/3 grade to that vital C/4 grade - or even above!

This fundamental jump of at least one grade could make a huge difference to their life, helping you to get their dream job or gain a place on your ideal course.

GCSEs are available in English, maths and science and they are open to students of all ages. The courses are taught by experienced staff, who are dedicated to giving the self-belief needed to pass their GCSEs.

GRADING GCSEs

A new grading structure is now in place for all GCSEs. This now sees them graded from 9 to 1 instead of A* to G. The figure shown below indicates how the new grading system aligns with the existing one, with grades 4 and above representing roughly the same level as a grade C or above.

COURSE FEE INFORMATION

IF YOU'RE 16-18

If you're a home student* and are under 18 at the beginning of your course, you won't have to pay tuition or exam fees for most courses. You will have to pay exams fees if you need to resit an exam, however.

You may need to pay for course equipment and materials. You will be told about this at interview.

*Home students are people who have already lived in the UK or EEA for a minimum of three years for reasons other than education.

IF YOU'RE OVER 19

You may be eligible to receive financial help with course fees. If you don't hold a level 2 qualification (eg 5 GCSE at grades A-C) or a level 3 qualification (eg 2 A-levels) and are under 23 years old, you may be able to get a substantial reduction in your fees.

Also, if you select a course leading to a basic skill qualification (English or maths) there will be no tuition fees to pay.

You may also be able to claim for free or discounted courses at entry level and level 1 if you are aiming for a full level 2 course, do not already hold a qualification at this level and are under 23 years old.

ADVANCED LEARNER LOAN

If you're thinking of progressing onto a full-time course and are aged over 19 you may qualify for this loan.

To be eligible you must:

- Be aged 19 or over at the start of your course
- Be a UK resident
- Be applying to study on a course which is level 3** or above

**Defined by the government as a maximum of 3 A-levels; an access to HE course; level 3 and/or level 4 certificates or diplomas; an advanced or higher apprenticeship.

REFUNDS

For courses lasting longer than one term:

If you choose to leave your course within one month of it starting and the course is longer than a term, a refund may be made of fees paid, minus an administration charge and any payments made to examining or other bodies which cannot be reclaimed.

For courses lasting one term or less:

If you booked on a short course and cancel at least 10 working days before the course date, you will receive a refund of 80% of the course fee. If you cancel less than 10 days before the start of the course, or leave the course after it has started, no refund will be given.

If a course is cancelled by us, you'll receive a full refund of fees paid.

FINANCIAL HELP



We're here to help you get the financial support you need. The Student Finance Team, located in the Student Centre, can provide advice on grants that are available.

CHICHESTER COLLEGE LEARNING SUPPORT GRANT & BURSARY

This is our bursaries scheme for 16 to 18 year olds. This grant is funded by the Education Funding Agency and administered by the college.

This grant could provide you with:

- Access to free or subsidised travel
- Free or subsidised equipment, books or resources
- Free or subsidised childcare
- Free UCAS admin fees
- Free college meals
- Contribution towards enrichment activities linked to your course

If you are aged 16 to 18 and are currently in care, just leaving care, receive income support, employment and support allowance or personal independence payments, you may be eligible for the Learning Support Grant.

Financial help is also available for students aged 19 or over.

YOUR INTERVIEW

Don't worry - the interview is there to help give you advice and guidance on any additional help you might need and to make sure the course is right for you. We aim to arrange your interview within nine weeks of your acknowledgement letter.

STEP 3

ACCEPTING A PLACE

Within 2 weeks of your interview, we'll send you a letter to confirm that you've been offered a place. The offer will either be unconditional (you don't have to do anything) or conditional (you'll be told in your interview what the conditions are eg the GCSE grades you need).

You will need to complete the acceptance slip found in your letter ASAP and return it to us. Don't forget to return this slip - it's very important that we know you're coming!

STEP 4

STARTING COLLEGE
